The issue of a land dispute between the Navajo and Hopi was not new to Congress, since land title to the JUA had been disputed by the tribal councils for years. The people living on the land, however, were unaccustomed to fences and artificial land divisions; it was not uncommon for Navajo-owned livestock to stray onto Hopi reservation lands. In 1970, therefore, the Hopi Tribal Council created an ordinance declaring Navajo stock on Hopi land to be in trespass and subject to impoundment. This ...
